

Allens Pond Wildlife Sanctuary is a 595-acre sanctuary encompassing a coastal salt-pond, pristine salt marsh, barrier beach, coastal heath, shrublands, forested wetlands, and grasslands.

We strive to be a model for stewardship. We accomplish this with support from a corps of volunteers including people of all ages and local school groups. With their help we control invasive species, restore habitats, and conduct ecological monitoring of New England Blazing Star, saltmarsh grasses, salamanders, Eastern Bluebirds, Piping Plovers, Osprey, grassland birds, and butterflies.


